(B) Tea Drinking Tea drinking was common in China for nearly one thousand years before anyone in Europe had ever heard about tea. Slowly this habit spread until it reached England and today only very few Britons drink tea without milk . At first , tea was usually drunk after dinner in the evening . No one ever thought of drinking tea in the afternoon until a duchess found that a cup of tea and a piece of cake at three or four oclock stopped her getting " a sinking feeling " as she called it . She invited her friends to have this new meal with her and SO , tea . time was born .

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
