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### 内容概要

## 章节摘录

Each sound consists of a different number of vibrations in the process of its formation. All the vowels , for example , originate from the vibration of the vocal cords , but not from the other vibrations. Voiceless plosives , on the other hand , originate from the vibration in the oral tract when the air is suddenly released. Very often , however , there will be two or three kinds of vibration that are at work in the process of the production of a sound. Voiced plosives result from two kinds of vibration : the vibration of the vocal cords and the vibration in the oral tract when the air escapes suddenly. For a voiced affricate , all the three kinds of vibration are involved. Because of this , the voiced sound /ds/ has not only the characteristic of a plosive but also that of a fricative.

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
